POLST: Physician Orders for Life-Sustaining Treatment

A **POLST** form is a medical order that tells emergency health care professionals <u>what to</u> <u>do during a medical crisis</u> when the patient cannot speak for him or herself. It will tell the emergency medical responders and health care providers what your wishes are regarding resuscitation in case your heart stops. <u>This is your DNR (do or do not</u> <u>resuscitate) status.</u>

- It is often considered the short version of the advanced directive.
- Many states have their own individual legal form.
- If your state of residence does not have it's own form you may use the national POLST form available since 8/2019. Website link: <u>https://polst.org/national-form/</u>
